ON THE KEY QUESTIONS FACING OUR UNION THIS IS WHERE WE STAND:

- Our number one priority during the pandemic is the safety of our members and the public. Working from home must continue, exceptions only with union agreement. Mental health, well-being and stress levels must be urgently addressed.
- Homeworking should be extended to improve work/life balance not as a way of closing offices and cutting local services.
- With inflation at record levels a national campaign is needed to secure a 12% pay increase, stop the attacks on our pensions, jobs & services and ensure a fully resourced safe working environment both now and in the future.
- We are opposed to the current leadership's record of selling conditions for pay.
- We oppose privatisation of our services and the further extension of shared services. Return out-sourced work to the public sector, protect jobs and conditions.
- We need a strong political voice. We should only support political candidates who are anti-austerity and support the interests of our members and our policies.
- We believe changes to the structure of our union must extend democratic membership control not increase bureaucratic centralisation. Branch and Group structures are under threat - any changes must be only with the full consent of those affected.

About the Broad Left Network The Broad Left Network is a group within PCS made up of members and activists right across the union, including commercial services/ outsourced workers, and from all parts of the UK. We are socialists united around a programme of change, committed to reclaiming the union for members and to building a serious campaign, together with other like minded unions, to reverse the erosion of our pay and conditions.
